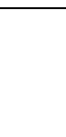

Admissions Overview

The University of Tasmania has published these guidelines to assist career advisors in helping students make decisions about which TCE subjects to take in Years 11 and 12 to meet admission requirements for study at the University.

If a student plans to study at tertiary level, they should select TCE subjects that provide options for a range of tertiary courses. Entry to tertiary study is very competitive, and not all students who satisfy admission requirements are offered a place in the course of their first choice.

Everyone with an interest in higher education is encouraged to apply by the on-time closing date – which is usually the last working day in September each year. Applications should be submitted regardless of expectations in Year 12 examinations. It may be that a student has not applied, performs better than expected in Year 12, and submits a late application - which may be too late to be considered in competitive courses.

Potential non Year 12 applicants are also encouraged to apply before the on-time closing date. It may take some time to assess complicated applications and an on-time application will enable a first round offer and time to make accommodation, work, childcare etc. arrangements.

For administrative and processing convenience all applicants for undergraduate courses are divided into two groups:

- a) those who have already completed or will complete secondary schooling (Year 12) qualifications in the current year (does not include those who have enrolled in post-secondary studies) and have met or expect to meet the general admission requirements of the University. Students in this group (applying for admission on the basis of Year 12 qualifications) will be referred to as Year 12 applicants. For most courses the application will be assessed solely on Year 12 results. Special entry conditions apply for courses offered in Visual and Performing Arts. Applicants will be contacted if required to attend interviews or auditions.
- b) those who are applying on the basis of some other qualification, special entry or life experience. Applicants in this group will be referred to as non Year 12 applicants. This group will be considered on the basis of previous tertiary study (complete or partially complete), including those seeking re-admission after exclusion or following a break in study, TAFE qualifications, mature age or previous work experience, professional qualifications, special entry, or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander admission.

English is the language for tuition and learning at the University of Tasmania and adequate communication skills (written and oral) are critical factors for success in any University course. All students are expected to have or to develop adequate proficiency in English. Deficiencies in English communication skills should be indicated on application and, where appropriate, support and other transition services may be identified when an offer of a place is made.

Year 12 Applicants – Tasmanian Applicants

Minimum Entry Requirements

In order to be eligible for tertiary entrance at a Bachelor level, applicants must satisfy the following four requirements:

- a) They must spend not less than two years in post year 10 study for the Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE) (or another approved senior secondary program) requiring enrolment in a combination of subjects designed for Years 11 and 12 [see Special Circumstances page 7 for exceptions].

It is strongly recommended that a student studies subjects with a total load of approximately 1200 hours over years 11 and 12.

- b) They must obtain a Satisfactory Achievement (SA) result or better in a minimum of four Senior Secondary Level 5C subjects, chosen from the schedule of subjects on page 12, approved by the University.
- c) They must obtain the minimum of four subjects in not more than two, not necessarily consecutive, sittings.

[Any number of attempts are permitted but the Tertiary Entrance Rank will be calculated from the TCE scores obtained in the two sittings which satisfy the minimum entry requirements.]

- d) At least three of the subjects referred to in (b) above must be taken in a single year of post year 11 study.

If applicants do not meet any of these requirements, it is still possible to gain entry to UTAS. Applicants who do not meet the above requirements will be considered for their course preferences on a concessional basis (see page 7), or for an alternative University entry pathway (see page 8).

Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER) Calculation

Selection of Tasmanian year 12 applicants for most courses will be based on the Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER). The Tertiary Entrance (TE) score is calculated by aggregating the scores of your best three Senior Secondary pre-tertiary subjects (from Year 12 or 13), together with the best score(s) of up to two other pre-tertiary subjects in that year or one other year. The TER is the percentile ranking of the Tertiary Entrance score. The TER ranges between zero and 99.95, and details the student's rank compared with other Tasmanian Year 12 students. A TER

rating of 80.00 indicates that the student has an overall rating equal or better than 80% of Year 12 school leavers in Tasmania.

Quota Selection

Many courses at the University are subject to quota selection. Selection of Year 12 Tasmanian applicants for most courses will be based on the TER.

Applicants may compete for entry with only the four subjects required to satisfy Minimum Entry Requirements, instead of the five referred to above, but should be aware that they will be competing against applicants with TERs based on five subjects.

Where selection is to be made on the basis of the applicant's TER, applicants will be selected in rank order. Where selection is based on criteria other than a TER, such as in Visual and Performing Arts courses, all applicants will be scored/ranked in merit order, on the basis of selection criteria determined by the Faculty Admission Committees.

Special Circumstances (Exemptions under the 'two-year rule')

The following groups of Tasmanian applicants may apply in writing to the Admissions Office for exemption from the 'two years in post year 10 study' component of the Minimum Entry Requirements:

- a) Applicants who completed year 11 other than in Tasmania. The application must include acceptable certified evidence of completion of Year 11. Such applicants would normally be expected to complete the minimum entry requirements in Year 12.
- b) Applicants who recommence TCE studies after a break of one year or more, due to employment or other circumstances. These circumstances may include such things as family responsibilities, overseas study or educational disadvantage. The application must include documentary evidence of employment or other circumstances acceptable to the Academic Registrar. Such applicants would normally be expected to complete the minimum entry requirements in Year 12.
- c) Applicants engaged in full-time or part-time employment while enrolled for TCE studies. The application must include documentary evidence of employment.

Concessional Entry

Students with an interest and capacity to succeed at University but who have not met the minimum entry requirements may be considered for admission on modified entry requirements.

To be considered for concessional entry an applicant's performance in the TCE and any supporting evidence of their capacity to undertake higher education study will be assessed.

Supporting evidence may take the form of advice from the relevant School/College Principal or Careers Advisor.

Offers made in these circumstances will identify any conditions you may need to meet, including undertaking foundation study and/or academic performance in your initial studies, to allow you to transfer at a later point to your preferred course of study. For more information on alternative entry pathways, see Entry Pathways on page 8.

This mechanism does not alter our standard entry requirements. The University will still welcome applications for special entry where students feel that their circumstances require individual consideration.

Entry Pathways

UTAS encourages and supports people's desires and plans to study at University. For applicants who do not meet general entry requirements, we may be able to offer a pathway to Bachelor level study via the Associate Degree.

The Associate Degree (itself a formal qualification for 2 years of full-time study) is offered in a number of disciplines:

- **Aquaculture**
- **Arts**
- **Business Management**
- **Computing**
- **General Studies**
- **Music**
- **Science**

The Associate Degree, when offered as a pathway to Bachelor level study, is a stepping stone process. It provides an opportunity for students to experience the requirements and demands of tertiary study, acquaint them with university life, and enable them to ease gently into study. Applicants offered a pathway option via an Associate Degree may only need to complete one or two semesters within the Associate Degree structure before being eligible to apply for admission to a Bachelor Degree.

Study in the Associate Degree may be full time or part time, and students can choose to study units from Bachelor Degree programs, as well as Preparatory and/or Foundation Units.

If you do not yet meet the general university entry requirements, or specific course requirements (e.g. a prerequisite subject) or have not been assessed and ranked highly enough at the time of application to be admitted to a place, you will be considered for an alternative course offer that best meets your needs and circumstances. This may be a place in a Bridging (Preparatory) course or a place in an Associate Degree that may subsequently lead into a degree program. An alternative course pathway offer will identify any conditions that you may need to meet including any academic performance requirements for you to transfer to your desired degree course (e.g. satisfactory completion of foundation units).

Riawunna, Centre for Aboriginal Education, conducts an orientation and assessment program to assist in preparation for study and to make recommendations for admission to the Admissions Committee of the relevant Faculty. People of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin over the age of 18 may apply directly to Riawunna for admission to Riawunna's Murina (Bridging) Program. Successful completion of this program will assist in gaining admission to many degree courses offered by the University of Tasmania.

UTAS is committed to guiding and supporting all its students to enable them to achieve positive academic outcomes. Our Pathways Officers work closely with the Student Advisers, who are available to assist all students, especially first year students, in their transition to tertiary study. Our Pathways Officers will liaise with the relevant Student Advisers on behalf of Pathway students so that services, support, information and advice, is available and accessible if needed.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma

Persons completing the full IB diploma qualify for admission to the University of Tasmania. A separate brochure 'IB admission guidelines 2009' is available from the Tasmanian schools/colleges offering the IB, from the University Admissions Office, the Student Recruitment Office or at http://www.studentcentre.utas.edu.au/admissions/forms_files. Applicants who do not complete the full diploma may be eligible for concessional entry.

Alternative Schooling

Applicants who have completed a 'non-standard' Year 12 course, such as a course which does not permit calculation of a Tertiary Entrance Rank, e.g. those who have undertaken senior schooling at home, or at a school which does not follow the Tasmanian Qualifications Authority syllabuses and examination procedures, should produce certification from their school or authority/board/council of completion of twelve (12) years of schooling. For any course with pre-requisites, see pages 18 – 23 of these guidelines.

Tasmanian Students Studying Overseas

Tasmanian students contemplating university study following an overseas exchange program are advised to undertake the exchange in Year 11. If the exchange is undertaken in Year 12 then the student must qualify for university entry in the exchange country and apply for admission to the University of Tasmania on the basis of the overseas qualification. Alternatively, the student may wish to qualify in Tasmania by undertaking Year 12 subjects via the School of Distance Education. Students who exchange in Year 11 should apply for an exemption under the 'two-year rule' (see page 7).

Interstate Applicants

Applicants completing Year 12 in another state will be assessed on the relevant interstate Tertiary Entrance Rank (e.g. ENTER, UAI, TER, OP) and will be selected in rank order with all other applicants.

Interstate Transfer Index (ITI)

The ITI is a national scale based on population statistics provided by the Australian Government Statistician and on Year 12 retention rates. It is a measure of the performance of students relative to other students who have attempted Year 12 in their state in the same year, but with an adjustment made in recognition that different proportions of students choose to enrol in Year 12 in each of the states and territories. In Tasmania, South Australia and Western Australia the ITI is commonly known as the TER. In Victoria and New South Wales it is referred to as ENTER and UAI respectively.

The index indicates that a Tasmanian student who gained a 2006 Tasmanian TE score of 114 had a TER of 99 and was, therefore, in the top 1% in this state. If you are applying to institutions in another state your Year 12 result will be reported as the TER which is directly comparable to that of students in VIC, NSW/ACT, SA/NT and WA.

Non Year 12 Applicants

Applicants in this category can apply for admission on the basis of TAFE or VET qualifications, previous higher education study (complete or partially complete), mature age, previous work experience, professional qualifications, if they are seeking re-admission after a course exclusion or break in study, special entry, or Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander admission. Applications will be considered from a broad range of applicants, including those with study, work or other experiences likely to demonstrate an interest and likelihood of success in University study.

To be considered for entry in this category applicants may need to complete a supporting statement. Applicants should consult the Admissions website at <http://www.utas.edu.au/apply> for details on addressing the supporting statement.

Aptitude Tests

So that the University can form a view on academic ability, certified evidence of recent results in an approved scholastic aptitude test, e.g. the STAT (Special Tertiary Admissions Test) or the SAT (U.S. based Scholastic Aptitude Test) may also be provided. Scores in such tests will not automatically qualify applicants for entry, but performance will be considered in combination with the other supporting information.

The University of Tasmania rarely requires an applicant to sit this test to gain entry. If you are in doubt please contact the Admissions Office on 1300 361 928 or by email Admissions@utas.edu.au before arranging to sit a test.

The STAT, written and assessed by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) (<http://www.acer.edu.au/stat/index.html>), is administered for Tasmanian residents by the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC). Testing sessions are usually held in Hobart during October and December each year. Other organisations which conduct STAT tests are listed on the ACER website.

Full details of STAT including dates, venues for testing sessions and registration fees, together with a copy of the VTAC application form which incorporates STAT registration, are in the VTAC Guide 2009. This is available from all major newsagents for \$12.95 (inc.GST) or can be accessed on the VTAC website free of charge. Counting of Other Qualifications

The Academic Registrar may deem qualifications other than TCE awards to be equivalent to any of the Tasmanian qualifications included in this statement. Such alternative qualifications may include TAFE qualifications, or passes awarded by educational institutions interstate or overseas.

Overseas Applicants

Overseas applicants who are not citizens or permanent residents of Australia must apply through International Services, see contacts on page 35.

Auditions/Portfolio Submission/Interviews

For some University courses, there may be a requirement to submit a portfolio, or attend interviews and/or auditions. Applicants applying for courses for which these are required will be contacted by the relevant University School with details of times/dates. Further information may be found at <http://www.utas.edu.au/apply>.

Acceptance of offers

You must receive an offer of a place before you can accept and subsequently enrol. If your application is successful you will be sent a letter of offer along with an acceptance form. Online applicants can do this through the Apply-by-web site.

Applicants wishing to accept an offer of a place in a quota-restricted course must do so by the date specified in their letter of offer, otherwise the offer will automatically lapse and places re-offered to other applicants.

All applicants are encouraged to accept their offer as early as possible.

Acceptance sessions

These sessions are designed to assist you with understanding your offer, the steps you need to follow in managing your enrolment and preparation for commencement of study.

When you accept your offer, you will have the opportunity to book your place at an Acceptance Session at the Hobart, Launceston or Cradle Coast Campus. Sessions will be run from 1.30-2.30pm and again at 5.30-6.30pm on the days nominated below.

The Advanced Honours Program – Faculty of Arts

The Advanced Honours Program in the Faculty of Arts aims to provide high achieving undergraduate students a learning environment in which their academic potential and creative excellence is encouraged and nurtured throughout the course of their undergraduate study.

The program runs concurrently alongside a number of degree courses in the Faculty of Arts and comprises seminars, presentations by visiting scholars and artists, forums and workshops during the academic year. Students will also have access to their own academic mentor who will provide individual academic mentoring and advice. To remain in the program students must maintain a distinction average in their study. Upon successful completion of their undergraduate degree students will gain direct entry into an Honours degree in the Faculty of Arts.

Year 12 students who expect to gain a TER/ITI score of 90 or above can apply for admission to the Advanced Honours Program within a single or combined degree course in the Faculty of Arts. The Advanced Honours program is available in the BA, BFA, BMUS and degrees combined with these courses. To apply for entry to an Advanced Honours Program select the relevant admission code, eg. *R3AA Bachelor of Arts (Advanced Honours)* or *L3DA Bachelor of Arts-Bachelor of Laws (Advanced Honours)*. For more information about the program and to access the full range of Arts degrees available within the Advanced Honours Program, go to the Faculty of Arts website at www.utas.edu.au/arts.

Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) and Bachelor of Visual Communication (BVC) applicants

Applicants are normally expected to have satisfied the University's admission requirements. It is a distinct advantage for applicants to have completed a practically orientated pre-tertiary Visual Arts or Design subject or TAFE certificate, or have equivalent experience and/or qualifications.

Applicants who do not meet these requirements should submit a folio consisting of no more than ten photographs, drawings, paintings or electronic images of work and a statement outlining their interest in the course including any relevant experience or qualifications. Unsuccessful applicants to Bachelor degree courses may instead be offered admission to the Associate Degree in Arts, and after successful completion can transfer to the BFA/BVC.

Where applicants have little or no evidence of a previous interest in or study of visual art or design they will be required to undertake a two week preparatory unit.

Course counselling will be offered to all successful applicants prior to the start of semester, to discuss choice of studio and potential careers.

Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery applicants

Applications for Medicine close at 5pm on Tuesday, 30 September 2008. Late applications for the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (M3N, M3NC) will not be considered.

Please note that applicants cannot add Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (M3N, M3NC) as a course preference after 30 September 2008. However, if applicants have indicated Medicine as one of their initial preferences in an on-time application, they can change the order of their preferences after this date (e.g. Medicine preference 3 to Medicine preference 1).

All applicants must complete the course prerequisites, TCE pre-tertiary (or equivalent) Chemistry and English, with a successful result prior to 1 February 2009. Provision of evidence of the successful completion is required by 8 February 2009.

Medical Rural Bonded Scholarship (MRB)

To apply for a Medical Rural Bonded Scholarship at this University, download the MRB expression of interest form from the Tasmanian School of Medicine website. Forms are available from http://www.medicine.utas.edu.au/admissions/pdf/mrbsform_09.pdf. Send this completed form to the School of Medicine. The Admissions Office does not manage this process.

Bonded Medical Places (BMP) Scheme - (M3NC)

Applicants selecting this preference need to be aware that there is no financial scholarship attached to these places and should look at the information provided by the Australian Government at this website:

Applicants who express interest in a BMP do not forfeit their eligibility to be offered a CSP.

Alternative pathways into Medicine and Pharmacy

Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery

UTAS accepts into Medicine up to 10 Australian applicants (including up to 6 from the Bachelor of Medical Research) each year on the basis of performance in the Bachelor of Medical Research, Bachelor of Biomedical Science, Bachelor of Biotechnology, Bachelor of Health Science, Bachelor of Science or the Bachelor of Environmental Science at UTAS. To be eligible to apply for the available places, applicants must have:

- completed a full-time year of study at UTAS in one of the listed degrees in the year prior to the proposed Medicine enrolment; and
- achieved a Distinction average (70%) or above for the two most recent semesters of full-time study; and
- satisfied the year 12 pre-requisites for Medicine - TCE pre-tertiary Chemistry (CHM5C) and Year 12 English (ENC5C or ENW5C or ENS5C) or equivalent; and
- completed the UMAT and have achieved a combined UMAT score at least equal to the lowest UMAT score in the cohort selected in other pathways.

Bachelor of Pharmacy

UTAS will accept into the Bachelor of Pharmacy up to 5 Australian applicants each year on the basis of performance in the Bachelor of Medical Research, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Biotechnology, Bachelor of Biomedical Science, Bachelor of Health Science or the Bachelor of Environmental Science at UTAS. To be eligible to apply for the available places, applicants must have:

- completed a full-time year of study at UTAS in one of the listed degrees in the year prior to the proposed Pharmacy enrolment; and
- achieved a Grade Point Average of at least 6 (a distinction average)
- satisfied the year 12 pre-requisites for Pharmacy - TCE pre-tertiary Chemistry (CHM5C) and Mathematics Methods (MME5C) or equivalent.

Students who complete appropriate units in the course prior to applying for Pharmacy may be granted credit for those units in the Bachelor of Pharmacy. It should be noted that, at this stage, this will not reduce the number of years of study in the Bachelor of Pharmacy, but students granted credit may have reduced workloads in some years of the program. Interested students should seek advice from the School of Pharmacy about units that may attract credit prior to undertaking the alternative entry program.

Australian Maritime College (AMC) applicants

The Australian Maritime College (AMC) integrated with the University of Tasmania (UTAS) on 1st January 2008. You should not use this guide if you wish to apply for a VET/VTE course offered by AMC. Conditions of Offer

If you are successful in gaining a place you will be sent a letter of offer. You will need to check your start date carefully as some applicants are required to attend short courses prior to their enrolment.

Seafaring Training Courses

Applicants for Seafarer Training courses with the Australian Maritime College may apply at any time by completing a paper application by selecting 'apply by post' at http://www.studentcentre.utas.edu.au/admissions/forms_files/index.html Seafaring applicants should include proof of AMSA approved sea service and Certificate of Competency with their application if required. Successful applicants should note the equipment requirements on their letter of offer.

Applicants for AMC Seafarer training courses are not required to include a supporting statement unless applying for an entry level Seafarer training course (Pre Sea Training) without an appropriate academic background.

It is the student's responsibility to determine their ability to pass medical and eye sight test. (Medical and eye sight tests are not an admission requirement into the course but are an Australian Maritime Safety Authority requirement for AMSA Certificate of Competency issuance).

Law and Combined Law degree entry requirements

For 2009 entry the Faculty of Law will have a limited number of direct entry places available into the Combined Bachelor of Laws Degrees. To be eligible for entry applicants will need a minimum TER score of 90.

If you wish to apply for one of these places, and you are a Year 12 applicant, please put the relevant Degree with Introduction to Law as your first preference. For example, if you wish to be considered for the Bachelor of Economics and Bachelor of Laws (combined) indicate this by applying for Bachelor of Economics (+ Introduction to Law and Legal Systems). If you then achieve the required entry score, and there are enough places available, you will automatically be placed into the Bachelor of Economics and Bachelor of Laws (combined). Students are still required to complete the first year in another faculty (75%) in addition to the units LAW121 Introduction to Law and LAW122 Legal Systems.

If you do not have a TER of 90, you may still apply for entry. You should apply for a relevant degree with the units 'Introduction to Law and Legal Systems' in 2009 and be assessed at the end of the first year of study for transfer to a combined or straight Law degree.

Prerequisites for Admission in 2009

In addition to meeting tertiary entry requirements, students are required to complete prerequisite studies for particular courses. Prerequisites may be studies undertaken in Years 11/12, or they may be completion of courses or degrees, and are required before students are eligible for consideration. Prerequisites must be completed at pre-tertiary level.

The University will give two years notice of changes to prerequisites, permitting students to undertake new prerequisites in Years 11/12. A list of current prerequisite subjects and their codes are available on page 13. Note all prerequisite subjects are at pre-tertiary level.

TCE Score Statistics – Explanatory Notes

The TE Score Ranges on page 26 or advice based on this data should not be provided to anyone unless the qualifications below are made clear.

The information about TERs is made available primarily for the information of teachers and student counsellors. The information needs to be understood in the context of the University of Tasmania's admission selection process and is subject to the following qualifications.

- ◆ The data is based on those students who studied Year 12 in Tasmania in 2007, who satisfied the University's minimum entry requirements and who subsequently applied to the University of Tasmania.
- ◆ The data supplied is indicative and is supplied for information only. Places in 2009 or future years are not guaranteed to students achieving more than the minimum scores shown. Conversely, students should not be discouraged from applying for courses simply because they expect to achieve a lower score than that shown. The selection process allows a student to nominate 4 preferences and students are assessed for all preferences in order from 1 to 4. There is no disadvantage in nominating a course for which a student may not achieve the minimum score, as the selection process then simply moves on to assess the next preference as if it were the highest preference.
- ◆ Selection is based on ranking of the applicant cohort in each year and as there may be significant changes in demand for particular courses and in the quality of applicants for those courses, cut-off scores may vary either up or down from year to year.
- ◆ Data is not included on Visual and Performing Arts courses as entry to these courses is not simply based on the TER.

Whilst it is difficult to generalise, given the considerations outlined above, many students are interested in a broad indication of standards required. Given experience to date it seems likely that students will need to achieve a TER of at least 50 to be considered for entry to an undergraduate course. Students with a score of 65 or more should have a reasonable expectation of gaining entry to their course of first choice, except for high demand courses such as Medicine and Pharmacy. For students below a score of 50 an offer will be considered on an individual basis following assessment of any extenuating circumstances. Students are encouraged to nominate the full four preferences to maximise their chances of gaining entry.

For the undergraduate courses listed, Tasmanian school leavers who meet the University's minimum entry requirements (or who are considered under the provisions for concessional entry) are ranked on the basis of their TER for each of their nominated preferences. Where the course has specific subject prerequisites, students without those prerequisites are excluded. Offers are made to students in order of rank until the course quota is filled or until the acceptable minimum score for the course is reached.

A student's application for a course may be rejected for the following reasons:

- ◆ the student has not met the minimum requirements for University entry;
- ◆ the student has not passed specified prerequisite subjects for the course;
- ◆ the student has a score below the point at which the course quota is full; and/or
- ◆ the student has a score below an acceptable minimum for the course.

Applications are assessed strictly in order of preference until either the applicant is made an offer in the highest preference for which they are eligible or they are found to be ineligible for all nominated preferences. If an applicant is unsuccessful in all their preferences the University will endeavour to provide alternative course options or pathways.
